Dear Tom:

I enclose herewith a copy of the program which you had forwarded to me and on which I have inserted certain suggestions. In regard to the speakers, I have written Mr. Digby and talked to him by telephone and feel reasonably confident that he will accept an invitation to appear on the program. The same effort is being made to have Mayor Morrison appear on the program and I hope to have a definite commitment from him by Sept. 28th. May I suggest a short talk by D. N. Rockwood, Union Producing Co., who will take office as President of N.O.G.S. on Oct. 1st. I think a few words of welcome plus his thanks to the committees of N.O.G.S. and to the contributors to N.O.G.S. who are making possible certain special events for which N.O.G.S. is wholly responsible and liable, are in order. I think five minutes will be sufficient for his part of the program. Please call attention to the fact that plane flights over the Delta will have to be cancelled due to the unavailability of planes.

I am happy to report that the advertising program is going reasonably well and that I anticipate that we will raise from \$1000 to \$2000. Our own campaign for funds is progressing nicely and I think we will be in good financial condition for this meeting.

I am enclosing a page on which I have listed the entertainment features being sponsored by N.O.G.S. The walking tour and bus tour for the ladies will be nominal in amount and, provided we are able to raise enough money, will be free.

We are hoping that we will have sufficient funds to give the ladies a cocktail party at no cost to them. There will be a charge of \$5.00 for the smoker for the men on the evening of Thursday, Nov. 15th. The cocktail party will be at the expense of the N.O.G.S. on Friday, Nov. 16th, from 5:00 to 7:00 P.M.

The delegates will be presented with two tickets entitling each delegate to a Sazerac cocktail for each at a bar to be set up alongside the registration desk. This will be a slight introduction to the meeting, courtesy of N.O.G.S.

Charles DeBlieux suggests that his position as Chairman of the Program be switched to such times as he will not be on the program. I have inserted at the last of the program the name of Charles Doh and the title of his paper. Use your discretion at working this into the program. I have advised him that it is too late to insert his manuscript in the annual publication, but that he should prepare his paper and be ready to present it. I also enclose a list of the local committees and of the G.C.A.G.S. committees which will probably need a little touching up for their final form. I entrust them to your tender mercies as you see fit.

I think it would be well if you could come to New Orleans in the not too distant future and meet with our group in order that we may coordinate all efforts, in particular as to costs and as to the price of the registration fee. By that time we may have a good idea as to the shortages or surplus and may adjust our figures accordingly.

Perhaps I am somewhat late in advising you, but I have made arrangements for N.O.G.S. to transfer \$500 to the account of G.C.A.G.S. for any funds that may be needed. You may, of course, feel free to draw on these as you need them.

In reply to your telegram regarding Atwater's abstract, please proceed by title only. I do not anticipate that the abstract will be ready in time to include in the publication - sorry.
